OCCUPATIONAL THERAPY IN VARIOUS PRACTICE SETTINGS

Occupational therapy in orthopedic conditions (such as but not limited to arthritis, hand injuries, fractures, nerve injuries, tendon injuries, cumulative trauma disorders, ergonomics among others), neurological conditions (such as but not limited to stroke, acquired brain injuries, degenerative conditions, tumors, cerebellar conditions, dementia, myelopathies, multiple sclerosis among others), pediatric conditions (such as but not limited to cerebral palsy, autism, learning disabilities, school system among others); psychiatric conditions (such as but not limited to schizophrenia, mood disorders, anxiety disorders, personality disorders, substance related disorders, group therapy among others); role of occupational therapy in community and health promotion

BASIC RESEARCH AND STATISTICS

Biostatistics related concepts and terminology such as mean, median, mode, sampling; research study designs, evidence-based practice

STANDARDIZED ASSESSMENT TOOLS

Details of various standardized tools used in occupational therapy practice for measuring different aspects of functioning including activities of daily living, roles, interests, play and social participation. Assessment of client factors such as memory, cognition, range of motion, sensation, tone, mood, balance, coordination, among others. Concepts related to reliability and validity of tools.
