Research orientation; Networking for research; Future postdoctoral opportunities in guest speakers laboratories/industry ties; Generation of research environment; Promotion of peer discussions; Handson grant writing workshop where student can write a real grant for submission at national level granting agency (e.g. ICMR) if the group can be created in that manner; Building Mentor and Mentee relationships.
