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Qualitative Research in Health Care

Research is a scientific inquiry and finding a solution for a particular problem. There are several methods of constructing the research designs and two broad approaches are quantitative and qualitative research. Qualitative research method is gaining importance though quantitative research and is elementary method of research. Qualitative research focuses on understanding the research question in idealistic and humanistic approach.

Several problems of healthcare with "No easy" answers and are in need of solutions to improve the quality of care. The quality of care is also affected by the behaviors, attitudes and perspectives of professionals' health care organizations. Qualitative research is used in understanding people's experiences, beliefs, behaviors, attitudes and interactions. It is also used to recognize the obstacles, for identifying what really is important for patients and carers, identifying and describing the ways for improvement. Qualitative studies give voice to the study subjects, permit the participants to share their experiences, and enhance the involvement of everyone related to the study thus reaching to the areas where quantitative research is not amenable. The findings generated from qualitative data will help to add new dimension for interventional studies which cannot be obtained from quantitative research alone. Qualitative researches can be undertaken in assessing the new technology, methods and national health system Programmes to rule out the effectiveness. Thus the qualitative research offers numerous methods in understanding what is more important for both patients and healthcare providers and have major contribution and thus to improve the quality of health care.

The qualitative research conducted in healthcare should be trustworthy, credible, consistent and transparent for applying the findings. Report on robust procedural description of the qualitative study should be given as any other study to enhance the trustworthiness. The details of the study should be explicit and transparent. The descriptions should be adequate with proper explanations and justifications to understand the logic for readers or reviewer. For enhancing the credibility of the research, the researcher can practice reflexivity, triangulation, and considerable description on interpretation process, quoting the verbatim from the data to support the illustrations. Applicability and transferability of findings depends on depth of the data to decide whether it fits into the context. It should be sufficient for the researcher or clinician to view the findings applicable and meaningful in the context of healthcare. Adequate sampling techniques to get the rich data, multiple data collections for obtaining maximum insight may be essential for getting insight and data saturation.

In health care, qualitative research is gaining increased recognition. It enables the health care providers to answer the questions which are not answered by quantitative research. However, the qualitative researcher should be trustworthy, credible, consistent and transparent in designing, conducting and reporting the findings to understand the phenomenon under the study, relevant to the context of the setting and culture in which it has been researched.

Importance of Conducting & Communicating Research in Nursing

Research in nursing is a driving vigor for the professional nursing practice. Research evidences helps to keep the nursing practice current and relevant. It increases confidence among the nurses through critical thinking, clinical reasoning and helps to make a good decision. It serves as a marker for health care quality.

Science and technology has evolved momentously in the area of nursing demanding manifold knowledge and skills. In order to keep the nurses abreast of the advancement in the area of nursing practice, the research findings have to be disseminated through publications in professional journals. Without knowledge of current research, the nursing care provided by the nurses becomes inept. Ensuring the communication of the quality research findings in nursing will yield in nurses providing the optimum care for their patients.

Committee on Publication Ethics (COPE) has produced guidelines which set out the basic principles and standards which takes account of the ethics in research publication. The key notion underlying the guidelines are to prevent readers from being misled by unreliable publications thereby prevents negative impact on the outcome of practice.

CNE on Health Policy Research





The Department of Community Health Nursing conducted Continuing Nursing Education (CNE) programme on Health Policy research on 24th January 2019 from 2.30 to 3.30 pm. Dr. Elissa Ladd, Global Health Coordinator and Dr. Patricia Lussier-Duynstee, Assistant Dean, MGH Institute of Health Professions, Boston were the resource persons for the CNE. Dr. Elissa Ladd gave an in-depth understanding of structure, process and outcome model in terms of Health Policy research and Dr Patricia explained on policy change with appropriate examples. The session was interactive and interesting for the participants. The programme was attended by all the faculty of Manipal College of Nursing, Manipal school of Nursing and PG students of the Department of Commerce.

Dr Basanti Majumdar, Professor Emeritus, McMaster University Canada, & an adjunct faculty of Manipal College of Nursing, MAHE Manipal interacted with varied group of researchers and faculty. The PhD scholars and faculty were involved in series of lectures during 4th and 5th March 2019.



PhD Scholars of MCON, and Department of Biochemistry attended a special talk on plagiarism, and how to reduce waste in research. Dr Basanti, highlightened on "How a research could focus on solid findings and reduce wastage?" and stressed that, original work and correct citations could help reduce the effects of plagiarism.



Faculty also attended the session on scientific writing. She emphasized on the art of writing, the language used and the authenticity of the research papers as per the expectation of the journal. One to one interaction and mentoring forum was provided to faculty who felt the need for a push to acceptance of the research paper. She also highlighted the bright side of international collaborators in writing grant projects and also how one can publish ethically in high impact journals. On 5th of March, 2019, the M.Sc. Nursing students had an interactive session on Focus Group Discussion (FGD). Live focus group discussions took place showing a path so as to how an ideal focus group happens in health care. Live demonstration of FGD made an amazing learning experience to the young researchers.

Workshop on Research Methodology & Statistics





Manipal College of Nursing Manipal, MAHE conducted three days' workshop on Research Methodology and Statistics from 28th March 2019 to 30th March, 2019 at Centre for Continuing Education and Interprofessional Development (CCEID), 5th Floor, Health Sciences Library Building, MAHE, Manipal. The programme was formally inaugurated by the Chief Guest Dr Poornima Baliga, Pro-Vice Chancellor-Faculty of Health Sciences, MAHE, Manipal. Dr. Poornima Baliga, in her speech, emphasized on the importance of research and motivated the participants to bring out quality publications with the quality research work by forming teams and inculcating the healthy research culture. The experts shared the session on various titles such as Writing Research Proposal, Qualitative Research Design, Mixed Method Research, Quantitative Research Design, Ethics in Research, SPSS, analysis and interpretation of data including test of significance, Communicating Research Findings. The three days' workshop concluded with closing remarks by Dr. Anice George, Dean, MCON, Manipal.

Workshop on Qualitative Research Methods & Analysis







Manipal College of Nursing, Manipal in collaboration with SAMARTH – an NGO focused on social science research & training organised three days' Workshop on 'Qualitative Research Methods & Analysis' from July 8 – 10, 2019 at MCON Manipal. Dr Anice George, Dean, MCON, Manipal briefed the participants about the workshop & welcomed the Resource persons. Dr. Shuba Kumar, Social Scientist and Dr Rani Mohanraj, Psychologist & Founder Members of SAMARTH, Chennai were the Resource persons for the workshop.

The highlights of the workshop were: Understanding the basics & methodological aspects of Qualitative Research, various sampling techniques that can be adapted, approaches and analysis, including coding & developing themes. Every session was followed by a group activity, where participants actively involved in forming Focus Group Discussion, Inductive & Deductive approaches of analysis. A total of 55 participants, from MCON, constituent units of MAHE, and from other Nursing colleges from Gujarat, Mangalore & Kerala enthusiastically participated in the workshop and got benefitted.

Short term course on Geriatric Health Care & Research



A short-term course on "Geriatric Healthcare & Research" was organized at Manipal College of Nursing Manipal as part of ICMR-DHR funded geriatrics project titled "Capacity Building for the nurse educators to conduct multidisciplinary research in Geriatric care". The course duration was two weeks starting from September 9th to September 21st 2019. A total of 22 participants from different States of India attended the course. The aim of conducting the course was to enhance the capacity of Nurse Educators on various aspects of Gerontological Nursing and Research.

With respect to Gerontological Nursing, topics covered were Assessment of elderly, Basic skills for Gerontological Nursing, Nursing management of older adults with common health problems, Psychosocial care of elderly, Ethical and legal issues related to care of elderly, Geriatric communication, guidance & counselling, Elderly abuse, and Rehabilitation of elderly. Geriatric Health Research sessions focused on different aspects of research methodology and statistical analysis with special emphasis on Geriatric Research.

Resource persons for the course were the senior faculty of Manipal College of Nursing Manipal, and from the department of Data Science, PSPH, Manipal Academy of Higher Education, Manipal.

Workshop on Systematic Reviews & Meta-analysis







Workshop on systematic review and meta-analysis was organized by PhD scholars of Manipal College of Nursing, MAHE, Manipal from November 4th to 6th 2019.

The objective of the workshop was to create awareness about systematic review and meta-analysis. The workshop was attended by 35 participants from different disciplines of MAHE and other institutions.

The experts from MCON & constituent institutes of MAHE shared sessions on various topics in systematic review & Metaanlaysis. The program was coordinated by Dr Baby S Nayak, Professor and Head, Department of Pediatric Nursing and PhD coordinator, MCON, MAHE, Manipal.

Workshop on Newer Guidelines in Clinical Research & Publication Ethics





The Institutional bioethics committee of Manipal College of Nursing & Centre for Bioethics, MAHE has organized a workshop on 'Newer guidelines in clinical research and publication ethics' for the 2nd year MSc Nursing students on 25th November 2019 at MCON from 2.30pm-5.00pm.

The first session was taken by Dr.Vikram Palimar, Professor, department of Forensic Medicine and Head of Centre for Bioethics committee of MAHE on the introductory part of bioethics and 'Publication ethics' including the Vancouver guidelines of the International Committee of Medical Journal Editors (ICMJE) and conflict of interest. The second session was taken by Dr. Vasudha Devi, Professor, Department of pharmacology, Melaka Manipal Medical College, MAHE Manipal. She highlighted on the difference between law and ethics. The research elements of autonomy, informed consent and vulnerability were discussed in depth with the illustration of different case scenarios. Also discussed on the types of data and risks involved in conducting research.

Around 21 participants attended the program. The workshop ended with the expression of gratitude by Dr.Melita Sheilini, Asst.Professor and the secretary for Institutional bioethics committee, MCON, Manipal.
