




## Manipal College of Pharmaceutical Sciences

## Manipal IPCs-funded MCOPS Golden Jubilee Commemoration Lecture 2022



#### Webinar on the Role of Oncology Clinical Pharmacist in Cancer Management

A webinar on the topic "Role of Oncology Clinical Pharmacist in Cancer Management" was conducted to mark the occasion of World Cancer Day (4 February), by Innovative Communication Club (I2C), MCOPS, Manipal. The webinar started at 03:00 pm with a

welcome speech by Mr Muhammed Rashid, Vicepresident, I2C, who coordinated the session and introduced the speaker, Dr Priyank Tripathy, Oncology Clinical Pharmacist, Health Care Global Enterprises Ltd, Bangalore.

The websinar had discussions about the role of oncology clinical pharmacists in dose monitoring during chemotherapy, new protocol designs for various new therapies, education to the patient, team contribution to the use of anti-infective including antimicrobials, antifungals and antivirals based on the type of organism and their site of infection. 
### Virtual Training and Release of Newsletter Organized by Innovative Communication Club In association with Centre for Drug Testing, MCOPS


# Student Exchange Committee MAPS-MCOPS Organized Live Interactive Webinar "What Next"









# Online Certificate Course "Introduction to Medical Writing" Launched by MCOPS






Shastri Conference and Lecture Series Grant Workshop on Data Science in Pharmacoepidemiology

25-29 March 2022: An interdisciplinary 4-day workshop "Basics of Data Science in Pharmacoepidemiology" was organized by the Pharmacy Literacy Club (PLC) funded by Shastri Indo-Canadian Institute (SICI), New Delhi in association with Genpro Research as knowledge partner on 25, 26, 28, and 29 March 2022. 



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## Student Exchange Committee of MAPS, India Organized a Virtual SEP





10 June 2022: A half-day workshop on *Designing* and Creating Online Courses was conducted by the Centre for Digital Learning, Manipal Academy






# Centre for Drug Testing, MCOPS, organized Online Course on "Design of Experiments"




27 June 2022: **Dr. Thomas**, Senior Director, Applications Science, Schrödinger-Europe, shared his views and











## Guest Lecture organized by Department of Pharmaceutical Chemistry, MCOPS

#### **GENESIS - NUOVO INIZIO**




















### MAHE Observed World Environment Day
